Whilst some locations are clear, some are not. Several locations have been identified from detailed review of the diaries and other information available on internet resources and publications those are detailed here

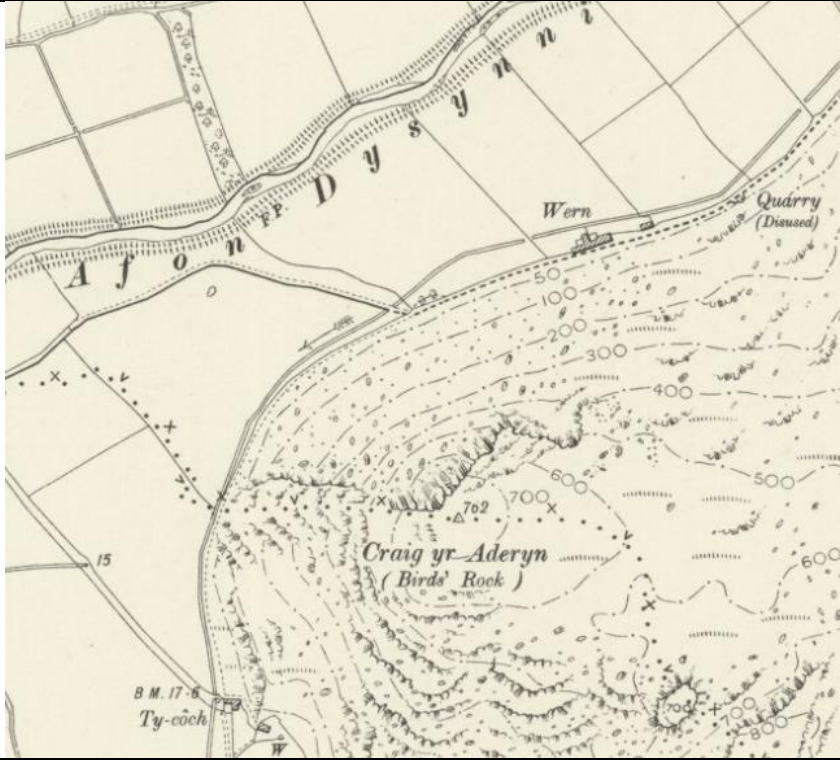
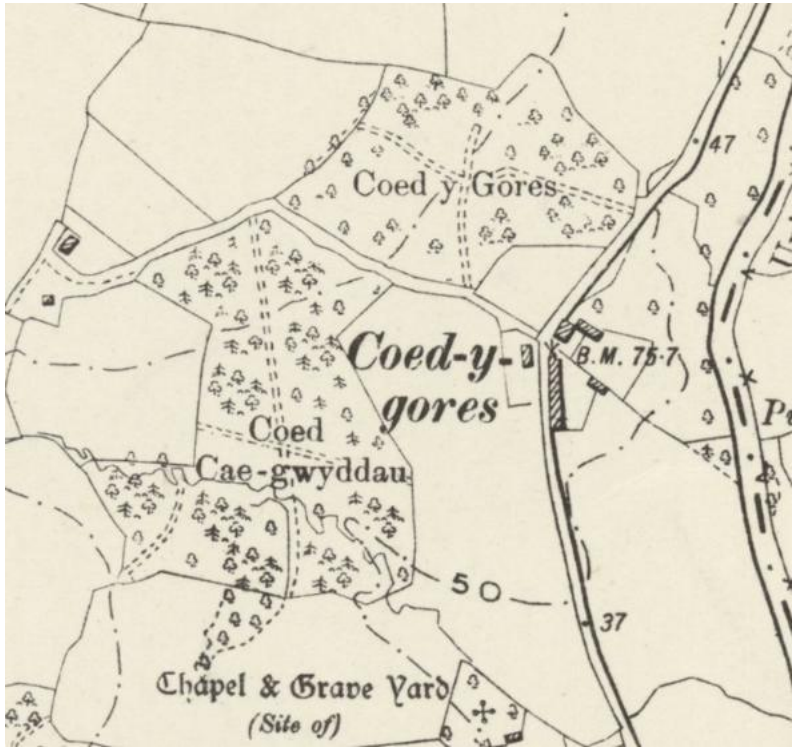

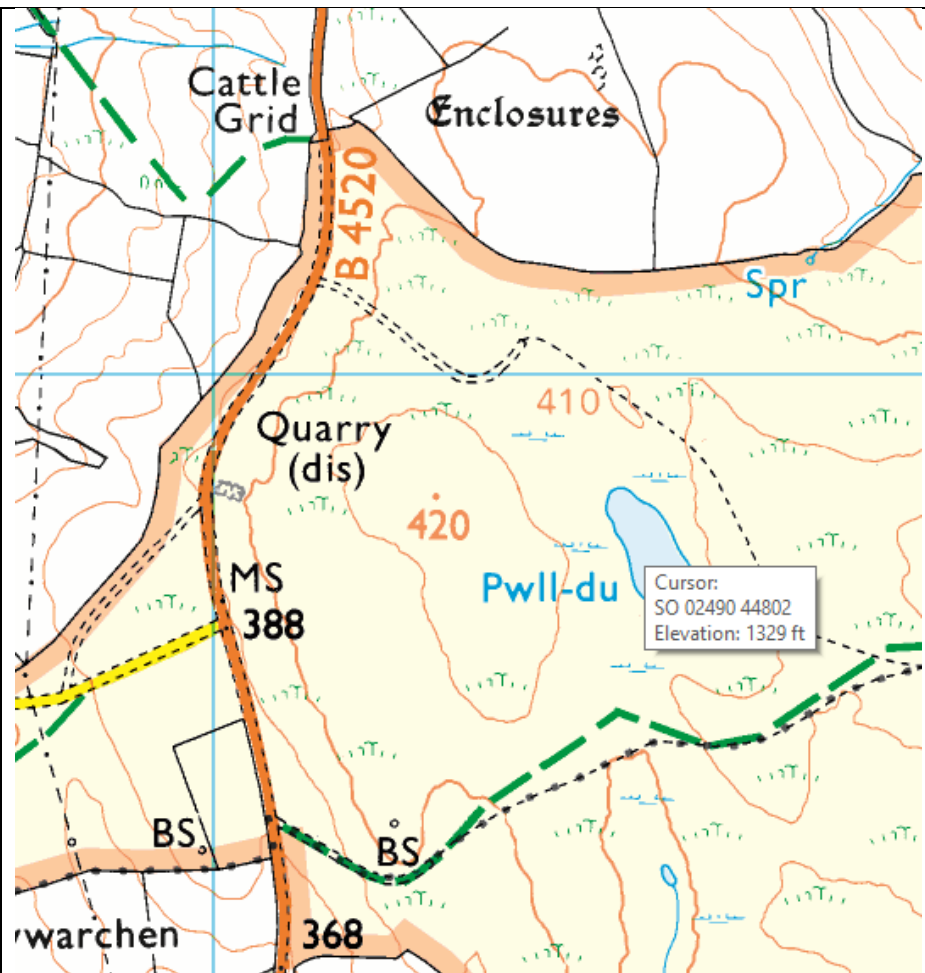

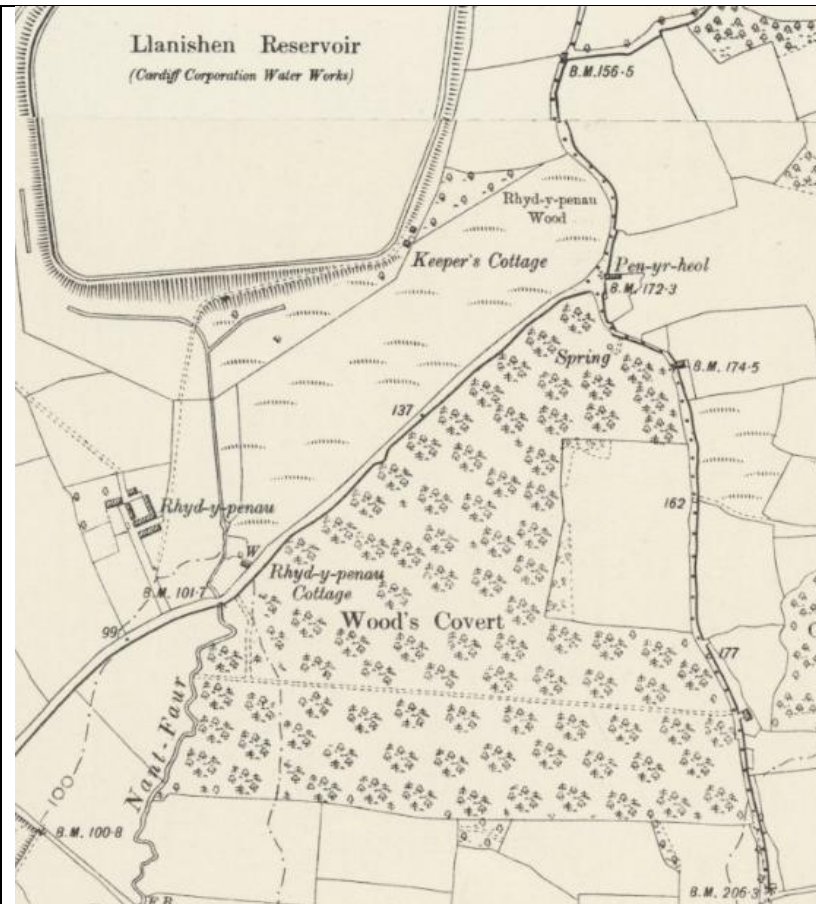
